Gaspé port

The exceptional natural advantages of the Port of Gaspé are internationally recognised. Gaspé harbour and its port at Sandy-Beach are located in a naturally sheltered area. An entrance canal at least 500 metres wide with a constant depth of 20 metres provides access to the port's vast expanse of water (4 kilometres by 1.5 kilometres)
