Gaspé regional airport

The Gaspé airport has been owned by the Town of Gaspé since 1997. It has been designated as a regional and local airport under the terms of Transport Canada's *National Airports Policy*. The runway is 1,350 metres in length and planes can land at the airport 7 days a week. Car rental service is available at all times. The Gaspé airport meets all the requirements set out in the *Air Regulations (Aeronautics Act)*, and complies the standards and recommended practices for airfields (TP-312).



Railroad

The railroad runs along the southern shore of the Gaspé Peninsula from Gaspé to major urban centres. This infrastructure provides transportation for both passengers and merchandise. Your business would be able to make judicious use of this means of transportation, often vital for certain sectors of economic activity.

Road nets

National highway 132 encircles the Gaspé Peninsula. It is used by buses that provide public transit, parcel delivery and messenger services, and by trucks transporting bulk goods. Moreover, it offers breathtaking views for the enjoyment of travellers throughout their journey.
